

HIPAA & Notice of Privacy Practices

Maliszewski Psychology, LLC is herein referred to as “I,” “We,” or as “your provider.”

Maliszewski Psychology, LLC is committed to maintaining and protecting the confidentiality of the individual’s PHI. Maliszewski Psychology, LLC is required by federal and state law, including the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (“HIPAA”), to protect the individual’s PHI and other personal information. Maliszewski Psychology, LLC is required to provide the individual with this Notice of Privacy Practices regarding their specific policies, safeguards, and practices. When Maliszewski Psychology, LLC uses or discloses an individual’s PHI, we are bound by the terms of this Notice of Privacy Practices, or the revised notice of Privacy Practices, if applicable.

I. My Pledge Regarding Your Personal Health Information:

- I understand that health information about you and your health care is personal. I am committed to protecting health information about you. I create a record of the care and services you receive from me. I need this record to provide you with quality care and to comply with certain legal requirements. This notice applies to all of the records of your care generated by this mental health care practice. This notice will tell you about the ways in which I may use and disclose health information about you. I also describe your rights to the health information I keep about you, and describe certain obligations I have regarding the use and disclosure of your health information. I am required by law to:
 - Make sure that protected health information (“PHI”) that identifies you is kept private.
 - Give you this notice of my legal duties and privacy practices with respect to health information.
 - Follow the terms of the notice that is currently in effect.
 - I am also required by law to provide you with adequate notice of your rights and my legal duties if I create or maintain records protected by 42 C.F.R. Part 2.
 - I can change the terms of this Notice, and such changes will apply to all information I have about you. The new Notice will be available upon request, in my office, and on my website.

II. How I May Use and Disclose Your Health Information:

The following describes the ways Maliszewski Psychology, LLC may use and disclose PHI. Except for the purposes described below, Maliszewski Psychology, LLC will use and disclose PHI only with the individual’s written permission. The individual may revoke such permission at any time by writing to Maliszewski Psychology, LLC [11620 Arbor St., Suite 200, Omaha, NE 68144].

- For Treatment: We may use and disclose PHI for the individual’s services. For example, Maliszewski Psychology, LLC may disclose PHI to doctors, nurses, technicians, or other personnel, including people outside Maliszewski Psychology, LLC who are involved in the individual’s medical care and need the information to provide the individual with medical care.
- For Payment: We may use and disclose PHI so that others may bill and receive payment from the individual, an insurance company or third party for the treatment and services the individual received. For example, we may tell the individual’s insurance company about a treatment the individual is going to receive to determine whether the individual’s insurance company will cover the treatment.

- For Health Care Operations: We may use and disclose PHI for health care operation purposes. The uses and disclosures are necessary to make sure that all Maliszewski Psychology, LLC patients receive quality care and to operate and manage our office.
- Appointment Reminders, Treatment Alternatives, and Health Related Benefits and Services: We may use and disclose PHI to contact the individual to remind them that they have an appointment with Maliszewski Psychology, LLC. We also may use and disclose PHI to tell the individual about treatment alternatives or health-related benefits and services that may be of interest to the individual.
- Research: Under certain circumstances, Maliszewski Psychology, LLC may use and disclose PHI for research. For example, a research project may involve comparing the health of patients who received one treatment to those who received another, for the same condition. Maliszewski Psychology, LLC will generally ask for the individual's written authorization before using the individual's PHI or sharing it with others to conduct research. Under limited circumstances, we may use and disclose PHI for research purposes without the individual's permission.
- Incidental Use and Disclosure: We are not required to eliminate every risk of an incidental use or disclosure of your PHI. Specifically, a use or disclosure of your PHI that occurs as a result of, or incident to an otherwise permitted use or disclosure is permitted as long as I have adopted reasonable safeguards to protect your PHI, and the information being shared was limited to the minimum necessary.

III. Special Situations in Which I May Disclose PHI Without Your Consent:

- As Required by Law: We will disclose PHI when required to do so by international, federal, state, or local law.
 - To Avert a Serious Threat to Health or Safety: We may use and disclose PHI when necessary to prevent a serious threat to the individual's health and safety or the health and safety of others. Disclosures, however, will be made only to someone who may be able to help prevent or respond to the threat, such as law enforcement or a potential victim. For example, we may need to disclose information to law enforcement when a patient reveals participation in a violent crime.
 - Law Enforcement: We may release PHI if asked by a law enforcement official if the information is: (1) in response to a court order, subpoena, warrant, summons or similar process; (2) limited information to identify or locate a suspect, fugitive, material witness, or missing person; (3) about the victim of a crime even if, under certain very limited circumstances, Maliszewski Psychology, LLC is unable to obtain the individual's agreement; (4) about a death Maliszewski Psychology, LLC believes may be the result of criminal conduct; (5) about criminal conduct on Maliszewski Psychology, LLC premises; and (6) in an emergency to report a crime, the location of the crime or victims, or the identity, description or location of the person who committed the crime.
 - Abuse or Neglect: We may disclose your PHI to a state or local agency that is authorized by law to receive reports of abuse or neglect. However, the information we disclose is limited to only that information which is necessary to make the required mandated report.
 - Essential Government Functions: We may be required to disclose your PHI for certain essential government functions. Such functions include but are not limited to: assuring proper execution of a military mission, conducting intelligence and national security activities that are authorized by law, providing protective services to the President, making medical suitability determinations for U.S. State Department employees,

protecting the health and safety of inmates or employees in a correctional institution, and determining eligibility for or conducting enrollment in certain government benefit programs.

- **Business Associates:** We may disclose PHI to any business associates that perform functions on our behalf or provides Maliszewski Psychology, LLC with services if the information is necessary for such functions or services. All of Maliszewski Psychology, LLC's business associates are obligated to protect the privacy of the individual's information and are not allowed to use or disclose any information other than as specified in our contract.
- **Lawsuits and Disputes:** If the individual is involved in a lawsuit or a dispute, Maliszewski Psychology, LLC, may disclose PHI in response to a court or administrative order. Maliszewski Psychology, LLC also may disclose PHI in response to a subpoena, discovery request, or other lawful request by someone else involved in the request or to allow the individual to obtain an order protecting the information requested. However, for records protected by 42 C.F.R. Part 2, such records or testimony relaying their content shall not be used or disclosed in civil, criminal, administrative, or legislative proceedings against you unless you provide specific written consent or a court order is issued in accordance with 42 C.F.R. Part 2.
- **Health Oversight:** I may disclose PHI to a health oversight agency for activities authorized by law, such as audits, investigations, and inspections. Oversight agencies seeking this information include government agencies and organizations that provide financial assistance to the program (such as third-party payors) and peer review organizations performing utilization and quality control. If I disclose PHI to a health oversight agency, I will have an agreement in place that requires the agency to safeguard the privacy of your information.
- **Psychotherapy Notes:** If kept as separate records, I must obtain your authorization to use or disclose psychotherapy notes with the following exceptions. I may use the notes for your treatment. I may also use or disclose, without your authorization, the psychotherapy notes for my own training, to defend myself in legal or administrative proceedings initiated by you, as required by the Nebraska or Iowa Department of Health and Human Services or the US Department of Health and Human Services to investigate or determine my compliance with applicable regulations, to avert a serious and imminent threat to public health or safety, to a health oversight agency for lawful oversight, for the lawful activities of a coroner or medical examiner or as otherwise required by law.
- **Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Counseling Notes.** I may also maintain "SUD counseling notes," which are notes recorded by a substance use disorder provider documenting the contents of a counseling session. Any use or disclosure of these notes requires your separate written authorization, which cannot be combined with a consent for other types of records. You can revoke your consent at any time except to the extent that I have already acted upon it to disclose these notes in accordance with your initial authorization.

IV. You Have the Following Rights with Respect to Your PHI:

- **The Right to Request Limits on Uses and Disclosures of Your PHI:** You have the right to ask me not to use or disclose certain PHI for treatment, payment, or health care operations purposes. I am not required to agree to your request, and I may say "no" if I believe it would affect your health care.
- **The Right to Request Restrictions for Out-of-Pocket Expenses Paid for In Full:** You have the right to request restrictions on disclosures of your PHI to health plans for payment or health care

operations purposes if the PHI pertains solely to a health care item or a health care service that you have paid for out-of-pocket in full.

- The Right to Choose How I Send PHI to You: You have the right to ask me to contact you in a specific way (for example, home or office phone) or to send mail to a different address, and I will agree to all reasonable requests.
- The Right to See and Get Copies of Your PHI: Other than “psychotherapy notes” and “SUD counseling notes,” you have the right to get an electronic or paper copy of your medical record and other information that I have about you. I will provide you with a copy of your record, or a summary of it, if you agree to receive a summary, within 30 days of receiving your written request, and I may charge a reasonable, cost-based fee for doing so.
- The Right to Get a List of the Disclosures I Have Made: You have the right to request a list of instances in which I have disclosed your PHI for purposes other than treatment, payment, or health care operations, or for which you provided me with an Authorization. I will respond to your request for an accounting of disclosures within 60 days of receiving your request. The list I will give you will include disclosures made in the past six years unless you request a shorter time. I will provide the list to you at no charge, but if you make more than one request in the same year, I will charge you a reasonable cost-based fee for each additional request. You also have the right to request an accounting of disclosures specifically for your substance use disorder records protected under 42 C.F.R. Part 2.
- The Right to Correct or Update Your PHI: If you believe that there is a mistake in your PHI, or that a piece of important information is missing from your PHI, you have the right to request that I correct the existing information or add the missing information. I may say “no” to your request, but I will tell you why in writing within 60 days of your request.
- The Right to Get a Paper or Electronic Copy of this Notice: You have the right to get a paper copy of this Notice, and you have the right to get a copy of this notice by e-mail. And, even if you have agreed to receive this Notice via e-mail, you also have the right to request a paper copy of it. (This notice will also be available in your client portal and on my website).
- Right to Get Notice of a Breach: Maliszewski Psychology, LLC is committed to safeguarding the individual’s PHI. If a breach of the individual’s PHI occurs Maliszewski Psychology, LLC will notify the individual in accordance with state and federal law.
- Right to Request Restrictions: Individuals have the right to request a restriction or limitation on the PHI Maliszewski Psychology, LLC uses or disclose for treatment, payment, or health care operations. Individuals also have the right to request a limit on the PHI we disclose to someone involved in the individual’s care or the payment for the individual’s care, like a family member or friend. To request a restriction, the individual must make their request, in writing, to the provider by whom their care was provided. Maliszewski Psychology, LLC is not required to agree to the individual’s request unless the individual is asking us to restrict the use and disclosure of the individual’s PHI to a health plan for payment or health care operation purposes and such information the individual wishes to restrict pertains solely to a health care item or service for which the individual has paid us out-of-pocket in full. If we agree, we will comply with the individual’s request unless the information is needed to provide the individual with emergency treatment or to comply with law. If we do not agree, we will provide an explanation in writing.
- Out-of-Pocket Payments: If the individual pays out-of-pocket (or in other words, the individual has requested that Maliszewski Psychology, LLC not bill the individual’s health plan) in full for a specific item or service, the individual has the right to ask that the individual’s PHI with respect to that item or service not be disclosed to a health plan for purposes of payment or health care operations, and we will honor that request.
